

PARIS – GIVERNY – ROUEN – BEUVRON-EN-AUGE – NORMANDY AREA

After breakfast, we depart Paris and start the day with a visit to Giverny, home of Impressionist painter Claude Monet. The famous water garden at Giverny was the inspiration behind some of Monet's finest works. We explore his beautifully restored home and the studio where he created some of his masterpieces. You can also stroll through the peaceful gardens past his iconic lily pond — which is surrounded by willows, wisteria, and bamboo — and stand on the Japanese bridge immortalized in some of his most beloved works.

Then we continue to the city of Rouen to visit its great cathedral, of which Monet created a series of paintings. Today, several are exhibited in Paris' Orsay Museum. We'll have time to stroll along the cobblestone Rue du Gros-Horloge, which leads to the square where Joan of Arc was burned in 1431. We'll stop for an included lunch in Rouen. Next, we head out of Rouen and stop in Beuvron-en-Auge along the Route du Cidre for a cider tasting, before arriving in the Normandy area, where we overnight.

EXCURSION TO NORMANDY LANDING BEACHES

After breakfast, we head to the Normandy Beaches, the scene of the Allied Forces' landing on June 6, 1944, known as D-Day. First, we stop in Sainte-Mère-Église to visit the Airborne Museum, located next to the church where John Steele's parachute got caught in one of the steeples, as filmed in the movie "The Longest Day". Our next stops are Utah Beach, where we visit the memorial; Pointe du Hoc; and Omaha Beach. We continue to Arromanches, where we will see the remains of Mulberry Harbour in the bay — a temporary harbor built by the Allies to quickly offload men and cargo onto the beaches during the invasion of Normandy. We finish our tour at the Normandy American Cemetery and Memorial in Colleville-sur-Mer.

NORMANDY AREA - MONT-SAINT-MICHEL - SAINT-MALO


After breakfast, we visit the famous Mont-Saint-Michel abbey, spectacularly perched on a rocky isle in the Gulf of Saint-Malo. Enjoy free time to explore the area on your own. Later, we visit the Hotel de l'Abbaye for a tasting of their quality wines.

SAINT-MALO - LOIRE VALLEY AREA - BLOIS

After breakfast, our tour starts with a visit to a local goat farm and its cheese production. We'll enjoy a cheese tasting of local chèvre, a specialty of the Loire Valley. Next is the 16th-century Château de Chenonceau of Catherine de Medici. Then, we enjoy a guided tour of Château de Nitray and visit its wine warehouses, which have been operating for 250 years. We'll hear about its winemaking process, then partake in the Initiation to Oenology course — complete with wine pairing — followed by dinner.


BLOIS

After breakfast, we visit the smaller Friday market in Amboise that's set up along a tree-lined avenue. Enjoy free time to browse and shop. We then start our tour with the jewel of the French Renaissance; Château de Chambord. At Château du Clos Lucé, we'll marvel at an amazing collection of models of Leonardo da Vinci's inventions, painstakingly reconstructed from the drawings of the great Renaissance genius. We continue to Caves Du Père Auguste and its troglodyte wine cellar, where we enjoy a presentation of its winemaking processes, tour of the cellar, and wine tasting of five Appellation d'Origine Contrôlée wines accompanied by local charcuterie and goats cheese.

BLOIS - VERSAILLES - PARIS

After breakfast, we depart for the town of Versailles, built during the reign of Louis XIII. We'll visit the Marché Notre-Dame, the second largest market in France and the oldest market in Versailles. You will have some free time to explore the market. We continue to the lavish 17th-century Baroque Palace of Versailles, built by the Sun King, Louis XIV, with its magnificent State Apartments, Hall of Mirrors, and Royal Chapel. Our guide will bring Versailles' history to life during our visit, and we'll have leisure time to stroll through parts of the elegant 250-acre gardens. Louis XIII originally purchased Versailles and its surrounding land to serve as his hunting lodge. Later, his son Louis XIV decided to make it his seat of government, and in 1682, he installed his impressive court and numerous noble visitors in sumptuous surroundings — a symbol of absolute monarchy.
